PRIVACY OF CRIMINAL OFFENDER RECORDS


Whereas, on May 20, 1975, the U. S. Department of Justice issued regulations to protect the privacy of persons named in criminal history records; and

Whereas, these regulations apply directly to agencies which have received LEAA funds for records systems improvements, and to agencies which exchange criminal history record information with LEAA funded agencies; and

Whereas, the plans for the Security and Privacy of Criminal Offender Records and for the accuracy, confidentiality and security of Juvenile History Records were prepared by American Samoa Criminal Justice Planning Agency, circulated to public and private agencies, announced in the news media, and approved by the Governor for submission to the United States Department of Justice; and

Whereas, the Plans were approved on February 22, 1977, by the U. S. Department of Justice,

Now, therefore, I, Ray Coston, Acting Governor of American Samoa, authorize said Plans to be implemented as policy in the Territory of American Samoa.


